Summer of 2023 my life took a turn. I joined an organization named PASS, whose mission is to empower low-income students and develop their mental and physical health through the sport of tennis. They helped set me up to attend Arizona State University. That was my proudest moment yet. That's when I decided to give back to PASS and become a tennis coach and study-group facilitator in their education room.

I spent my time supporting students from other schools and backgrounds. I saw my own journey reflected in theirs. They wanted to dream big but lacked the support at home. I decided to be that support system and push them higher than their expectations because that's what a coach does. That's what family does.

I met an 8th grader named Josue who committed to ACT prep despite being the youngest student. He worked hard on the tennis court competing against older students, but keeping up academically with them was challenging, as he often lost focus. Despite that, I didn't give up on helping him because we were both very similar. The son of immigrant parents, I wanted to give him my support to follow his aspirations. To keep him focused I would walk him through problems and ask questions about math concepts.

I realized that being a facilitator is more than just teaching students. It means to lead them to a successful route where they can achieve anything they set their minds to. I know Josue now believes attending university is possible. He knows there is a community of supporters.

I'm proud to say I achieved my definition of leadership, on shaping a path for people like Josue and me to keep dreaming. Leadership means looking after your community, as well as creating a clear path for others to walk.

What is Arizona's Charitable Tax Credit?

The Charitable Tax Credit enables Arizona taxpayers to receive a dollar-for-dollar credit on their state taxes when contributing to qualifying charitable organizations.

When is the deadline for a tax credit donation?

For a 2024 Tax Credit, you have until April 15, 2025. Filings made on or before this date can be applied to either the current or previous tax year for AZ state taxes.

How much can I contribute?

Arizona residents can claim up to:

- Up to \$470 for single filers or heads of household.
- Up to \$938 for joint filers.
- This \$ amount credit is applied directly to your Arizona state tax liability.
